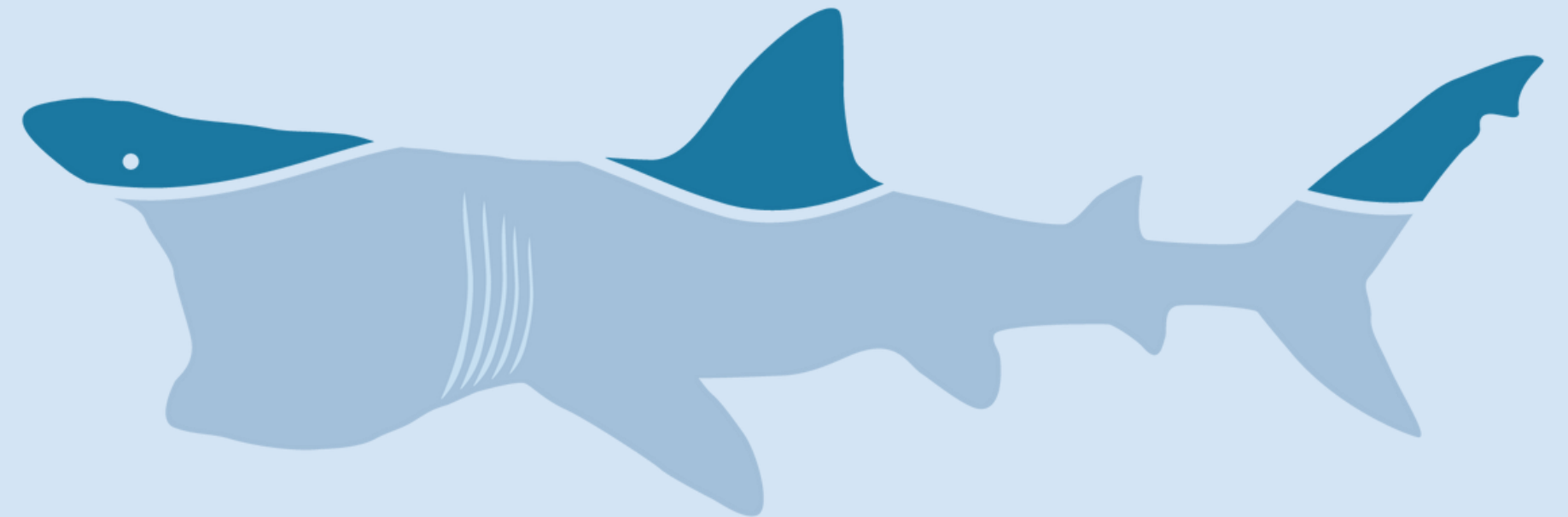


Eggcases and Basking Sharks - linking long term citizen science sightings data to the Digital Twin Ocean

Project Background

- ▶ There are >1200 species of shark, skates, rays, and chimaeras (Class: Chondrichthyes) globally
- ▶ Of these approximately 40% are **oviparous** (egg-laying), and embryos develop within toughened eggcases that are deposited on the sea floor or attached to seaweed.
- ▶ Once hatched, the empty eggcases often wash up on the beach. By looking at the size, shape, and features, it's possible to identify which species it comes from.

The Project

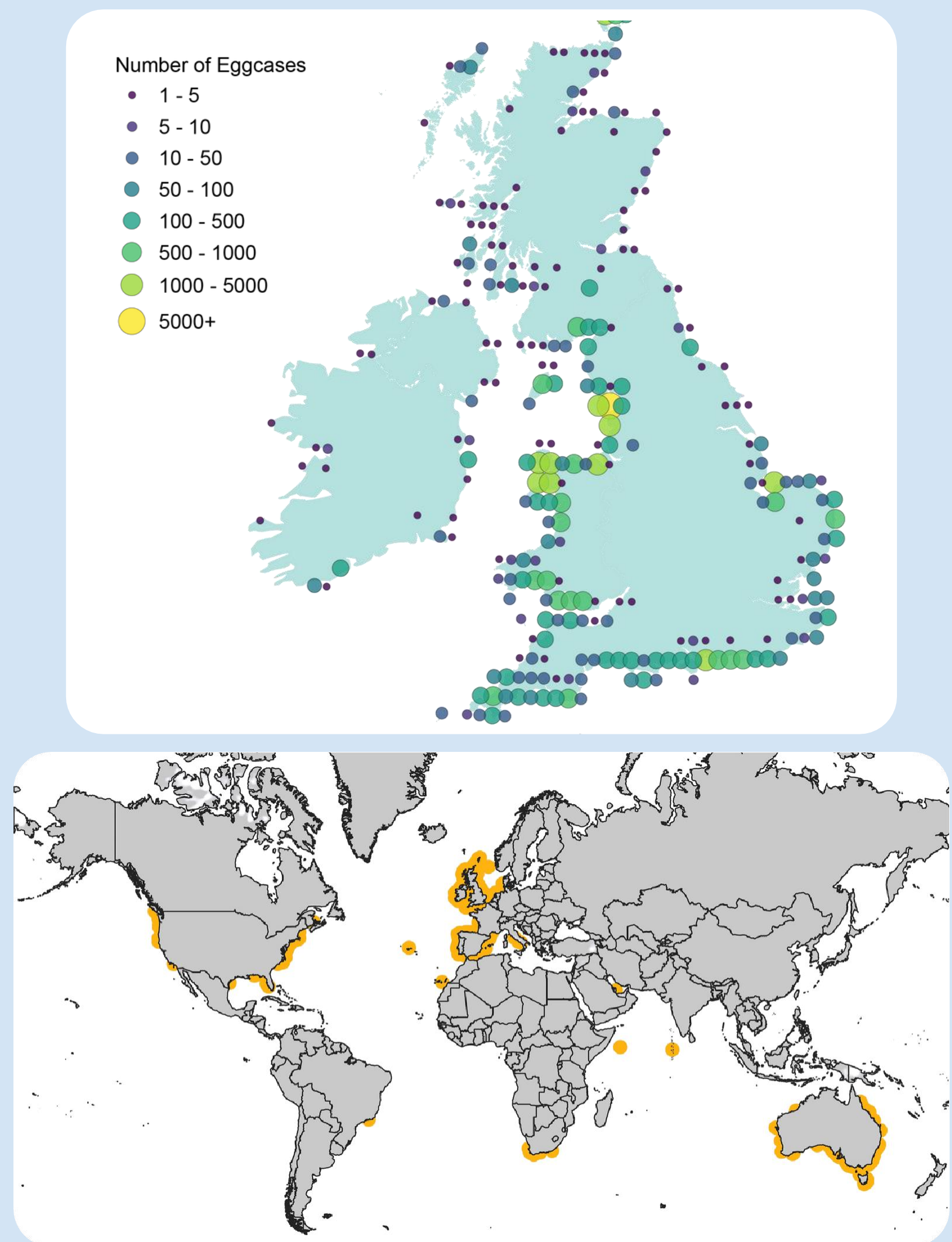
- ▶ Established in 2003. The Shark Trust's flagship citizen science recording project
- ▶ Encourages participants to search for eggcases that have washed ashore, or report those seen developing underwater
- ▶ By recording eggcases, we can gain a better understanding of the presence and diversity of oviparous (egg-laying) species in British waters – and beyond!





Project Stats

- ▶ over 37,000 records
- ▶ over 530,000 eggcases
- ▶ over 55 verified species
- ▶ over 40 countries



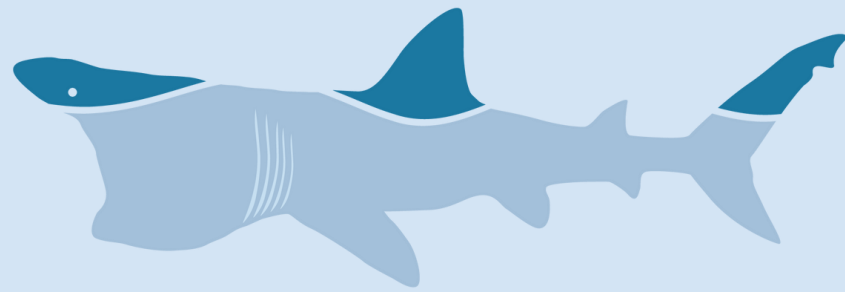


The Project

- ▶ Basking Sharks are seasonal visitors to British and Irish waters, with a few well known hotspots
- ▶ The project encourages citizen scientists to record Basking Shark sightings
- ▶ Contains data collated from multiple organisations, including the historic Marine Conservation Society's (MCS) Basking Shark Watch dataset

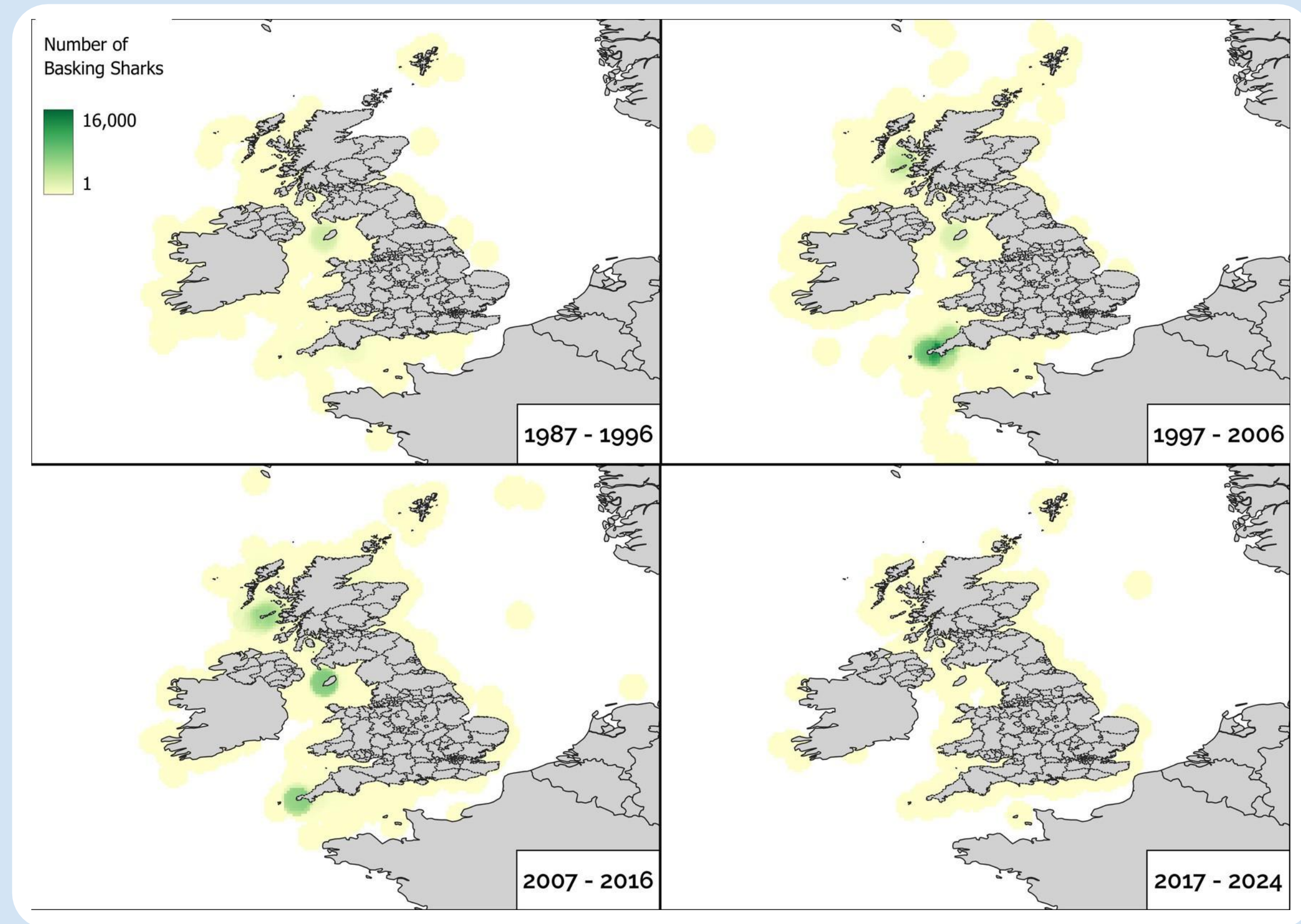

- ▶ over 18,000 records
- ▶ over 65,000 individuals



Next steps



- ▶ Unify and QC 22 years worth of data
- ▶ Make data open access
- ▶ Contribute to data portals/archives
- ▶ Identify key subsets for reporting



- ▶ Unify data from different sources
- ▶ Address duplicate data
- ▶ Make data open access
- ▶ Contribute to data portals/archives
- ▶ Establish a data directory for the wider community
